



Eastward Shift In Tornado Activity



Both temperature and precipitation outlook for the next 2 weeks.


Based on the Maps above here at Schwartz farms, within the next 10-14 days our precipitation should remain near normal compared to other years. The temperature however, looks to be leaning above average.



The past couple days has been noticeably hazy in the air. The smoke from the Canadian wildfires has been moving south into our area. The rain in the forecast should help resolve the

haziness and poor air quality that we have been experiencing.

Side-by-side comparison of the U.S. Drought monitor:



Above you can see the amount of moderate drought conditions in Ohio significantly decreased since June 13th to just abnormally dry conditions. This is thanks to the rain that we have been receiving, it has significantly reduced the drought conditions throughout the state of Ohio.


Replant Update:

Schwartz Farms has had 3 growers total replant soybeans for a variety of reasons. One of our growers in Pennsylvania had to replant 100 acres due to slugs and poor stands because of the dry weather. Another grower in Pennsylvania had to replant 35 acres due to dry weather and poor stands. A grower in western Ohio replanted 600 acres due to frost damage on the beans he planted in early April. He had very poor stands due to the dry weather we had experienced in the end of May/beginning of June. This same grower called recently and is now worried about his replants because he has received 7 inches of rain and they are flooded. These are very abnormal circumstances; no other growers are experiencing these same things. Where he is located in western Ohio has received multiple storms pass through with significant amounts of rainfall. We had heard from our grower in New York that it looked like he had the best stands he has experienced, and that the beans look to be doing really well.

Both corn and soybean conditions were each 66% good to excellent across the state of Ohio, which is an increase from our last report. Generally, all crops are reacting positively to the Rain we have been receiving, which is allowing for the rating to continue to increase as the weeks go on. As of Sunday June 27th, 96% of soybeans were emerged across the country.
